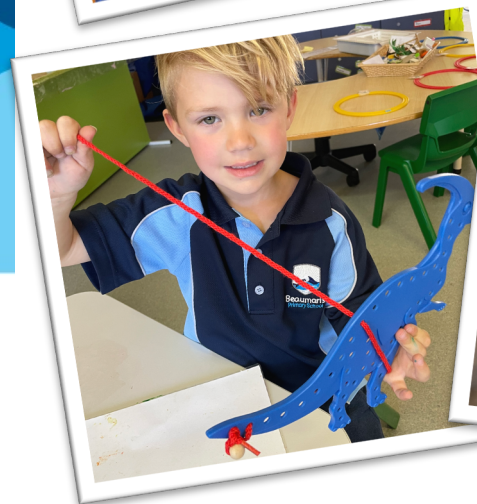

At Beaumaris Primary school we are committed to providing for our students a strong, holistic foundation for relevant learning, living and thinking in the 21st Century.

Beaumaris Primary School is an Independent Public School in Ocean Reef. Known nationally as a 'High Demand School', Beaumaris is strongly committed to implementing a thinking curriculum for our students as we move deeper into the 21st Century.

Beaumaris Primary School is a leading school in our system and it is our mission to build your child's creative thinking abilities through play based learning whilst maintaining a clear focus on the

explicit teaching and learning of the Western Australian curriculum.

In addition to focusing on **Every student, every classroom, every day** at a school level, Beaumaris is committed to implementing the Departmental priorities:

Positive Behaviour

Positive Behaviour and Pastoral Care is a strong focus at Beaumaris. The students are encouraged to develop a good sense of self-worth and value other people's needs and contributions. The students can help contribute to the positive class and school tone through their actions, considerations and vocabulary.

Our Beaumaris Behaviour expectations are:

1. **We do Our Best**
2. **We are Responsible**
3. **We are Respectful**
4. **We are Safe**

These four cornerstones of our Positive Behaviour program support students to adopt increasing responsibility and accountability for learning and create a culture of *high performance* and *high care* across our school. We believe these behaviour expectations will make a difference to our students, not only now but in the future, as they venture out into the world ready to take a place in society as lifelong learners.

At Beaumaris, the Zones of Regulation is **an approach used to support the development of self-regulation in children.**

PATHS (Promoting alternative thinking strategies) is also a comprehensive program that all Pre-primary children are exposed to. The premise of the program is to facilitate the development of self-control, positive self-esteem, emotional awareness and interpersonal skills.

The PATHS Curriculum fosters an environment where children can become independent thinkers who will feel motivated to "do the right thing," because they understand why it is important. Children can improve their behaviours because they believe they should (and are capable of doing so) not solely because an external authority believes this.



AWARDS

Individual Awards

We use a Faction award system and incentive program to promote positive behaviour. Students have the opportunity to receive a Faction Token that contributes towards their faction points. We also reward a student's effort through verbal and written encouragement.

Shout Out Certificates

Shout Out certificates are recognised at assemblies. Each student in Pre Primary will receive a merit award.



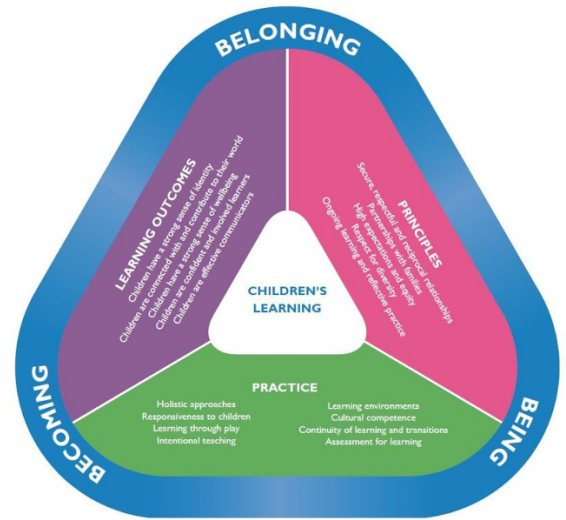
Our Early Years Statement

Beumaris Primary School develops diverse and confident life-long learners. Our dedicated educators deliver a unique blend of explicit instruction, authentic, relevant and meaningful learning experiences which support the development of the whole child. We value parent engagement and are committed to providing a quality holistic education that values each child's ability, cultural background and interests; providing opportunities for students to be the best they can be.

At Beumaris Primary School we pride ourselves in providing a high quality, research based program that is developmentally appropriate for all children. We recognise the early years as being critically important, in terms of building valuable foundations for future learning and with high collaboration amongst our educators we ensure that we develop the 'whole child'.

The learning program in Pre Primary is centred around the principles and practices of The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) and our curriculum content is aligned with the Western Australian Curriculum. The National Quality Standards Framework (NQS) also underlies our planning to ensure we optimise all children's learning and development.

We believe that integrated teaching and learning approaches enables learning across multiple domains. Early Year's educators at Beumaris Primary have been shaped and refined by creating a unique blend of explicit and play-based learning. We recognise that play is essential for early learning and is best supported by meaningful interactions with educators. Our programs are personalised and engage students in active learning (through hands-on, creative exploration and investigation) alongside formal instruction. This includes, explicit teaching and development of literacy and numeracy skills and a range of social and emotional life skills.

Discovery Time

Your child may talk about engaging in Discovery Time during their school day. Discovery time is inquiry based learning and is used as a hook to further learning during English and Mathematics lessons. It is a time when children learn to make sense of the world around them and educators can introduce and reinforce concepts that children need to learn but in a way that engages each child's interests and individual needs. In a playful inquiry setting, children explore concepts, practice skills and exercise their decision making skills through play opportunities. All children access the curriculum at their point of need through well thought out and open ended curriculum resources. Through knowing our children, their needs, developmental levels and interests, resources are introduced to the learning environment to entice and support the development of the whole child.

Useful Information

Special Events, Incursions and Excursions

Special events such as incursions are planned during the year to integrate with the Western Australian Curriculum. You will be informed through a parent note and school app when an incursion or excursion will take place. Any notes that are required for special events can be returned via the secure boxes in the Pre Primary rooms.

The school has **CompassPay, eftpos and direct deposit** facilities available to our community. We encourage parents to use **CompassPay** as the preferred method of payment.

School attendance

Library

Students attend Library each week and borrow books according to their ability. Students must have a waterproof Library bag to take a Library Book home.

Sun safety

We are a Sun Safe School and it is compulsory that all students wear the approved school hat when outside. Students not wearing a hat during outdoor activities are required to remain in shaded areas.

Digital technology

Digital technology is integrated across the curriculum with students investigating, communicating, managing and operating various digital technologies. Pre Primary has a bank of iPads that are used in classrooms to promote creativity and critical thinking skills in our students.

Supporting Your Child's Learning at Home

Learning to read is a very exciting time in a child's development and we value your support at home area to find a seat.

Home readers will go home during term 2 and we will notify you with the possibility of a workshop to support your child with learning to read.

When reading at home with your child we encourage you to:

- Give your child time to explore the illustrations and flip through the book before reading.
- Listen to your child read or if they require support read the story with your child.
- There is no expectation initially that your child will be able to read the text but knowing the features of a text is something you can support your child with.
- Discuss the story with your child and ask them to retell it in their own words. This will allow them to show understanding of the book and help to develop good recall and sequencing.
- Promote reading as an enjoyable time and encourage the whole family to dedicate time for reading



Medical Information

Allergies

We are an allergy aware school. All children with allergies will be managed on a case by case basis. Classroom teachers will communicate to parents when cooking or food preparation activities will occur as part of a learning journey.

Medical action plans are located in every classroom to ensure that teachers are aware of individual student medical responses and students are safe at all times.

We have numerous students that are at risk of anaphylaxis. The school strives to be a 'nut aware' school and to minimize risks for these students. Please help us reduce the risk to keep these students safe by avoiding these foods coming into school.
