Beaumaris Primary School is an Independent Public School in Ocean Reef. Known nationally as 'High Demand School', Beaumaris is strongly committed to implementing a thinking curriculum for our students as we move deeper into the 21st Century. Catering for just over 500 students, it is our mission to build your child's creative thinking abilities whilst maintaining a clear focus on the learning and explicit teaching of the Western Australian curriculum.

AWARDS

Individual Awards

We use a Faction award system and incentive program to promote positive behaviour. Students have the opportunity to receive a Faction Token that contributes towards their faction points. We also reward a student's effort through verbal and written encouragement.

Shout Outs

Shout Outs are recognised at assembly each fortnight. Students in Years 3-6 will receive a Shout Out award within a two-year period.

Badges

Over a two-year timeframe
Students have the opportunity to
earn badges in 7 categories. Sense
of Community, Personal Best, Well
Being, Visual Arts, LOTE, Performing
Arts and Physical Education.
Students must meet certain criteria
in order to achieve each badge.
Badges will be awarded during
assemblies in Terms 2-4

Book Awards

Book Awards are presented to two students per class. An Academic Book Award is presented to the student who has demonstrated consistent academic achievement. The Endeavour Book Award is for a student who has demonstrated significant personal progress and determination to achieve their goals throughout the year. These are awarded at the end of year Presentation Assembly.

Positive Behaviour

Positive Behaviour and Pastoral Care is a strong focus at Beaumaris. The students are encouraged to develop a good sense of self-worth and value other people's needs and contributions. The students can help contribute to the positive class and school tone through their actions, considerations and vocabulary.

These four cornerstones of our Positive Behaviour program support students to adopt increasing responsibility and accountability for learning and create a culture of high performance and high care across our school. Guided instruction provides students with the opportunity to strengthen literacy skills and create a variety of imaginative, informative and persuasive genres.

Within each area sit the four proficiency strands of Fluency, Understanding, Reasoning and Problem Solving. Mathematics is a key area of differentiated practice and it is integrated into other curriculum areas where possible. Our whole school approach to mental strategies through our 'Ten a Day' initiative helps to build and recall basic facts. Problem Solving and open Ended Tasks in all strands of Mathematics are a focus for Year 3. These support our students with developing critical thinking skills.

Useful Information

Special Events, Incursions and Excursions

Special events such as incursions and excursions are planned during the year to integrate with the Australian Curriculum. You will be informed through a parent note and school app when an incursion or excursion will take place. Any money that is required for special events can be returned in a labeled envelope. In the Year 3 block there is a secure box where permission notes and/ or money can be placed for special events.

The school has **CompassPay** and **Eftpos** facilities available to our community. We encourage parents to use **CompassPay** as the preferred method of payment.

Library

Students attend Library each week and borrow books according to their ability. Students must have a waterproof Library bag in order to take a Library Book home. Waterproof library bags are available from 'Uniform Concepts' in Joondalup.

Collaborative Sport

Year 3 sport is held weekly. This year the Year 3 sport time is Tuesday morning 9:00 - 9:55. Students participate in skills based activities designed to support their physical development, team skills and sportsmanship. Students wear their faction shirt for Sport.

Sun Safety

We are a Sun Safe School and it is compulsory that all students wear the approved school hat when outside. Students not wearing a hat during outdoor activities are required to remain in shaded areas.

Digital Technology

Digital technology is integrated across the curriculum with students investigating, communicating, managing and operating various digital technologies. Year 3 has a bank of iPads that are used in classrooms to promote creativity and critical thinking skills in our students.

Students are required to wear their faction shirts and the approved school hat for Sport.

Birthdays/ Celebrations

Given the multi-cultural nature of the Beaumaris community and cakes being a point of celebration across many cultures, the school allows the sharing of cakes for celebrations. Cake for other students is to be in individual portions in the form of cupcakes, and handed to eligible students at the end of the school day on the final siren.

The school strongly discourages the distribution of Iollies and chocolate to students, as per Education Dept. WA policy.

Crunch 'n' Sip

We are a Crunch 'n' Sip school and promote students making healthy choices. Your child is encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit/vegetable and a re-usable bottle of water. Crunch 'n' Sip should be pre-cut and stored in a sealed re-useable container.

HOMEWORK

Homework should support the development of each student's independence as a learner.

The objective of homework is to form part of a developmental learning program that is responsive to individual need, relevant to the classroom learning focus and further the partnership between school and home. Reading and independent tasks, games or manipulative tasks may be included in weekly homework.

You can assist your child with homework by providing a suitable environment and encouraging them to organise their time at home in order to adopt good homework habits.

We ask that parents discuss their child's homework with them and if any concepts are problematic, inform the teacher.

Home reading is strongly encouraged and is a key component to weekly homework. Books sent home are intentionally 'readable' so that students can focus on fluency and comprehension in home reading.

Students are encouraged to record their reading into their home reading journals and get a parent to sign. Student reading journals are checked weekly.

Medical Information

Allergies

We are an allergy aware school. All children with allergies will be managed on a case-by-case basis. ONLY. It would be greatly appreciated if you notify the class teacher before sending in cupcakes to celebrate your child's birthday. This will allow us to make appropriate arrangements for those children who have allergies to ingredients.

Classroom teachers will communicate to parents when cooking or food preparation activities will occur as part of a learning program.

Medical action plans are located digitally on Compass to ensure that teachers are aware of individual student medical responses and students are safe at all times. Badges are available for students with a diagnosed condition of Anaphylaxis, Epilepsy, Asthma or Diabetes. Parents of these students should see the Administration Office for a badge they can sew onto their child's school hat.

Sick Students

When a child is feeling unwell they will be provided with a quiet space to rest in the wet area. However, if the teacher determines the child to be too unwell, parents will be contacted to pick their child up from the Administration Office for their own wellbeing.
